The provided criteria for "dependent children" or "other persons" align with the requirements that family size align with whom the parent could claim as a dependent on a U.S. tax return if the parent were to file a U.S. tax return at the time of completing the 2024-2025 FAFSA. As a result, the parent should NOT include any unborn children in the family size.

Single	\$12,950 Gross Income
Married – filing joint return	\$25,900 Gross Income
Married – filing separately	\$5 Gross Income
Head of Household	\$19,400 Gross Income
Qualifying widow(er) with dependent	\$25,900 Gross Income

Federal student aid now requires consent be given by **Parents (biological, adaptive and stepparent)** to approve the sharing of federal tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form.
