The Paramedic Technology program at Bismarck State College offers both an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree and certificate options. These options allow you to kick start your career as an EMT and to advance in the field.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT) CERTIFICATE

The EMT Certificate of Completion is designed for those wishing to become entry level patient care providers and provide basic life support with ambulance services, fire departments, law enforcement, security and a variety of other settings. EMS certification is also required to advance to the higher levels of Emergency Medical Services certification such as the paramedic.

PARAMEDIC TECHNOLOGY CERTIFICATE

This certificate option is available for students who are already Nationally Registered or State Licensed as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). Current EMT certification or licensure is required prior to entry into the EMS 200-level courses. Emergency Medical Technician courses are available through Bismarck State College to meet this prerequisite.

PARAMEDIC TECHNOLOGY (AAS)

This degree option is available for students pursuing an Associate in Applied Science degree who are already Nationally Registered or State Licensed as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). Current EMT certification or licensure is required prior to entry into the EMS 200-level courses. Emergency Medical Technician courses are available through Bismarck State College to meet this prerequisite.
