Those working in human service must be emotionally stable, creative, flexible, able to manage time effectively and work with diverse groups and individuals of all ages, social and cultural backgrounds, and life situations. Good communication skills are a must, along with the ability to show care and concern and respect in client relations.

The Associate in Applied Science Human Services degree is not listed as a transfer program, but careful course selection can provide a transfer option into a four-year college. Eligibility Worker is a certificate option within the Human Services program. This is a route available to become an Eligibility Worker with the state and county agencies working with social welfare programs.
